

Indicated below are primary items that 11th and 12th grade students are having troubles with in their reading.

1. Know how to think as you read.
2. Know how to overcome boredom.
3. Know how to adjust to an author's style.
4. Know how to avoid frustration.

The answer key below is for the reading check. The numbers to the right represent the 4 areas of student problem areas. Example: if a student missed #1 it might suggest that knowing how to think and overcoming boredom is a problem. After all 31 questions are answered and a composite is made a plan can be made for the student to overcome their area (s) of difficulty.
